The Dawes Arboretum Hosts Annual Ohio Sustainable Landscapes Symposium July 30

The Dawes Arboretum educates and advocates for native landscapes through day-long event

(Newark, OH) – The Dawes Arboretum continues its advocacy of native plants as they host the 11th annual Ohio Sustainable Landscapes Symposium on July 30 from 9:30am to 4pm. Programming led by Arboretum experts provides a day filled with education on all things edible, medicinal and livable landscapes.

Attendees, no matter the level of interest or gardening expertise, are invited to learn more about a variety of landscape types, including how to design and cultivate their green space as an entire ecosystem, while creating inviting and beautiful gardens at the same time.

“Advocating for native landscapes is important to us here at The Dawes Arboretum and we are so excited to bring the Ohio Sustainable Landscapes Symposium back again this year” said Luke Messinger, Executive Director for The Dawes Arboretum. “This event encompasses the conservation efforts we do here and helps make it possible for gardeners to invite some of the same practices into their own lawns and gardens.”
